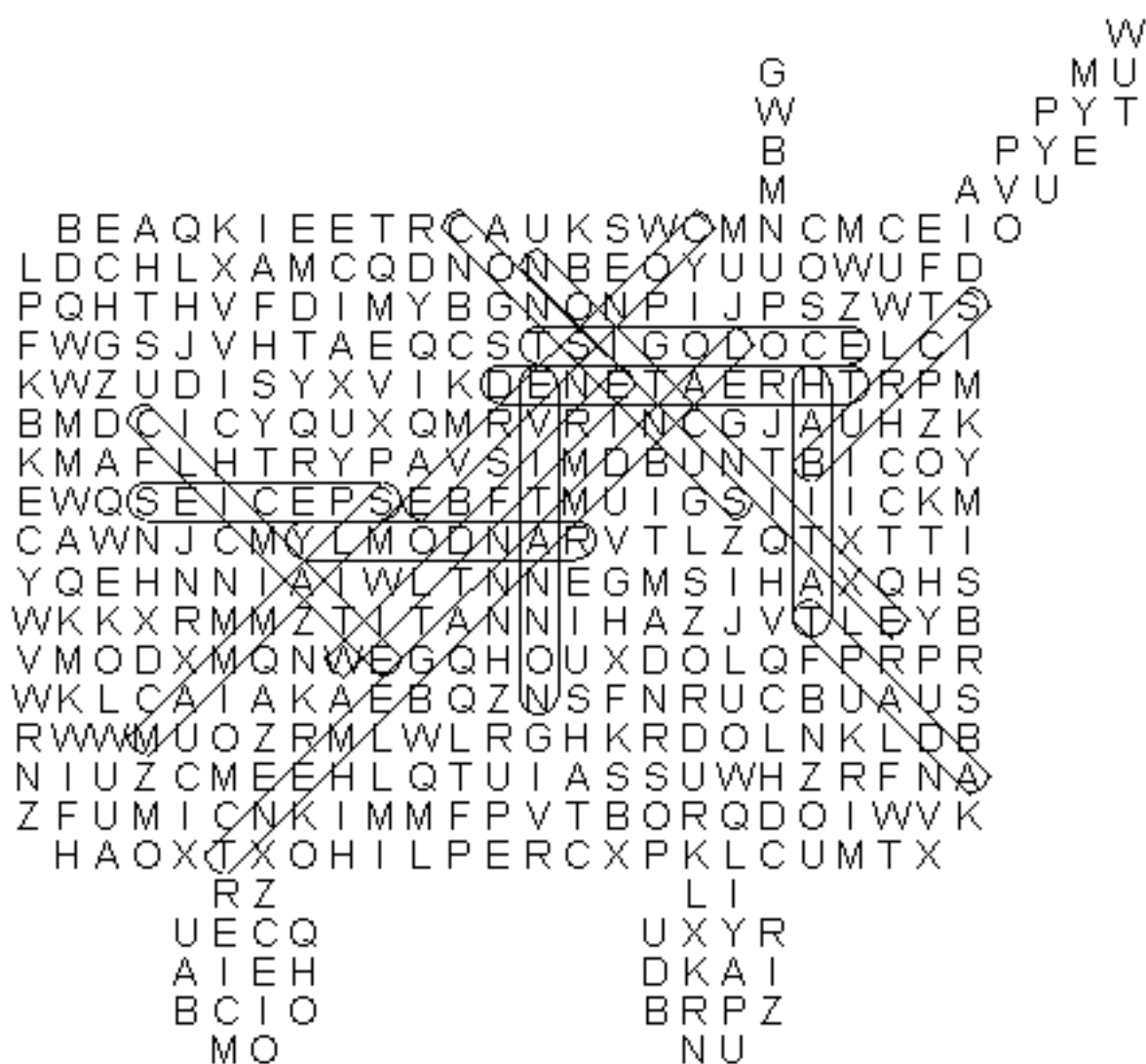


## Fighting Fire with Fire



1. (adapt) To change so as to fit new conditions.
2. (climate) The average condition of the weather at a place.
3. (consensus) Agreement of all or most.
4. (conserve) To avoid wasteful or destructive use of something.
5. (ecologist) A person who studies the relationship between living things and their environment.
6. (extinction) No longer existing.
7. (habitat) Environment where a plant or animal naturally grows and lives.
8. (land management) Decisions and actions involving natural lands to achieve specific purposes.
9. (mammals) Warm-blooded animals that have a backbone; Female mammals have glands to produce milk for feeding their young.
10. (nonnative) Not naturally occurring in an area.
11. (randomly) A way of selecting a smaller number from a group in such a way that all members of the group have the same chance of being selected.
12. (scrub) An area with short, stubby trees or bushes.
13. (species) Groups of organisms that resemble one another in appearance, behavior, chemical processes, and genetic structure.
14. (threatened) Legal term meaning the existence of the species is likely to become endangered in the future.
15. (wildfire) An uncontrolled wild land fire started naturally or by careless human action.
